CHILD AND ADOLESCENT SOCIAL SKILLS GROUPS

Participation in a social skills group is a powerful way of learning because children learn in the moment. Groups are fun, low pressure and engaging. Each group will include time for unstructured conversation and snack, as well as a set agenda for a particular skill to be taught and practiced. The majority of the time will be spent teaching and practicing these skills while the children are engaged in play, art and other cooperative activities -- this gives them real-life opportunities to practice and receive feedback on the skills just presented.

TOPICS INCLUDE:

Showing interest in others – active, whole-body listening
Appropriate greetings & joining in conversations
How to enter play
Maintaining conversations
Empathy / perspective taking
Showing respect
Using self-control / coping when upset
Being a good friend
Hosting a successful playdate
Good sportsmanship

WHO: Groups are available for multiple ages (ages 4-6, 7-9 and 10-13)

Participants may be grouped by developmental level, when appropriate

Each group is limited to 6 participants

Each group consists of a 12-week curriculum
